When you travel, one of the best ways to experience a place is through the food. Each plate is a story from the person who made it and the places they represent. So it's no surprise Virginia—the Birthplace of American Cuisine, has been at the forefront of the American dining scene for years. Travelers can experience Virginia with the tastes of thoughtfully selected, carefully sourced, local ingredients. They taste the history of Virginia, from sustainably farmed Chesapeake Bay oysters to meticulously cultivated strains of heirloom corn, in restaurants across the Commonwealth. The food served across the state by acclaimed Virginia chefs and at charming local eateries is rooted in more than just good taste. It provides a story of the land you're standing on. This deeper food experience is why Virginia is for Food Lovers.

- The Virginia food story boasts a wide variety of cuisine from the Appalachian culinary traditions in the southwest region to the Bordeaux-style wine in the Piedmont and the farm-raised oysters in Coastal Virginia.
- Many cities and towns across the state are consistently being recognized for their emerging culinary scenes, including Richmond, Alexandria, Charlottesville and Staunton.
- Virginia is America's first food region. Colonists at Jamestown combined English food cultures with those learned from Virginia Indians and created America's very first food region more than 400 years ago.
- Virginia boasts 275 wineries, 120 breweries, 40 distilleries, and 18 cideries.

TRAVEL EXPERIENCES

- The Restaurant at Patowmac Farm is the ultimate farm-to-table dining experience. Patowmac Farm was one of the first certified organic farms in Virginia. The restaurant is a glass conservatory building on the farm that serves Grown, Raised and Found prix fixe menus focused on local and organic dishes.
- Caromont Farm, located about 20 miles outside of Charlottesville, creates cheeses on-site from goats and cows in Virginia. They also offer farm tours, cooking classes, and farm dinners.
- Real Richmond Food Tours offers two-and-a-half-hour walking tours, stopping into several local eateries in Richmond to sample specialties and hear from chefs and owners.

The best food tells a story of the place it is from. Eating an oyster in Virginia captures the character of our waters in one quick, complex taste. The Virginia oyster tells visitors a story in every shell. This is why Virginia is for Oyster Lovers.

- Growing in the world-famous Chesapeake Bay, the Atlantic Ocean and its tributaries, Virginia oysters thrive in eight different regions producing oysters with distinct flavors, offering an oyster for every palate.
- The flavor of "The Virginia Oyster" from each region is unique, unlike any others in the world (a concept called "merroir," similar to the wine concept "terroir"). These exceptional tastes range in salinity, creaminess, and sweetness.
- All oysters are eco-friendly and actively filter the water they are grown in.
 The oyster industry is one of the few industries that as it expands, provides tangible, increased environmental benefits.
- The Virginia Oyster industry is one of the longest-standing industries in the state, going back to the time of the Jamestown settlers.
- The Virginia Oyster pairs perfectly with another recognized Virginia product:
 Wine! Some of our oyster regions share watersheds with Virginia wineries, proving the point that "what grows together, goes together."

- The Virginia Oyster Trail connects producers, farmers, purveyors, seafood restaurants and raw bars in Virginia's distinctive bay and river towns for an authentic oyster tourism experience.
- Visit Merroir for the ultimate oyster "tasting room" experience. Featuring the
 celebrated farms of Rappahannock Oyster Company, everything is served
 raw or cooked on an outdoor grill, small-plate-style and paired with craft
 brews and world-famous wines
- Sign up for the Chef's Table Tour at Pleasure House Oyster Farm. Hosted by Capt. Chris Ludford, owner and oyster farmer, this is a dining experience you won't forget as you stand in waders knee-deep in the Lynnhaven River at a table set up directly in the water at the oyster farm.

- Virginia offers 275 wineries that stretch across every region of the state, from the waters of the Chesapeake Bay to the Appalachian Mountains.
- Virginia has been named a top 10 wine destination, and our wines have been recognized around the world for quality.
- Virginia is one of the only wine destinations in the country where visitors can kayak to a winery, enjoy bluegrass music while sipping local wines, sample regional wines at a National Park or enjoy wine at a National Historic Landmark.
- Thomas Jefferson was America's first wine lover. His dream of wine grown and made in Virginia is now thriving around his homestead at Monticello and throughout the Commonwealth.
- Some of Virginia's top varietals are Viognier, Petit Verdot, Cabernet Franc, and Chardonnay.

- The Blue Ridge Whiskey Wine Loop is an intriguing tasting route with seven wineries, a whiskey distillery and many notable restaurants winding along the backdrop of Virginia's scenic Blue Ridge Mountains and Shenandoah National Park.

- Virginia is home to more than 120 craft breweries... and growing!
- Virginia's craft beers have won numerous awards from the Great American Beer Festival and World Beer Cup among others.
- Larger craft breweries are making Virginia home, including the iconic West Coast brewer, Stone Brewing Company, which is opening their first East Coast operation in Richmond.
- Craft breweries have become a family destination. Most places have music, food options, children's activities, and more.

- While in Richmond, take time to visit the Virginia State Capitol. Designed by Thomas Jefferson, it is the oldest legislature continuously operating in the United States
- Virginia's Historic Triangle includes three historic colonial communities-Jamestown, Colonial Williamsburg and Yorktown- and is also located close to popular attractions like Busch Gardens, Water Country and the Great Wolf Lodge, making this getaway perfect for families looking for a fun and educational vacation.
- Old Town Alexandria is the heart of the city that George Washington called home. It is a beautifully preserved historic district on the Potomac River right outside of Washington DC.
- Plan a visit to one of Virginia's many historic sites across the state. Monticello, the home of Thomas Jefferson, is located right outside of Charlottesville. Take a tour of the beautiful home and stop by Jefferson Vineyards, a winery located close to Monticello, producing wine true to Jefferson's original vision of winemaking in Virginia.

Music connects us all, and its melodies have been woven into the story of Virginia since the beginning. This legacy has culminated in historic moments like the 1927 Bristol Sessions, known as the "Big Bang of Country Music," and the cultivation of musicians who have helped shape the story of American music. Virginia's music scene boasts an array of genres from orchestra and opera at some of the nation's grandest concert halls, to rock, jazz and Blues at city nightclubs. Virginia's music venues provide music lovers hundreds of performances a year by world-famous musicians on stages around the state. This is why Virginia is for Music Lovers.

- Virginia is also home to a great variety of music festivals, including Bristol Rhythm and Roots, the Richmond Folk Festival, FloydFest, Lockn' and many others.
- Virginia's music venues range from historic movie theaters and opera houses to beaches and rock quarries.
- The City of Bristol is known as the Birthplace of Country Music because
 of the 1927 Bristol Sessions, which legendary country artist Johnny Cash
 referred to as "the single most important event in the history of country
 music."

- The Floyd Country Store has become a traditional gathering place on Friday nights for musicians, dancers and visitors from all around. The Friday Night Jamboree is an authentic experience shared by locals and visitors alike.
- The Crooked Road, Virginia's heritage music trail, winds through almost 300 miles of scenic terrain in southwest Virginia and connects major music venues.
- Virginia has legendary venues like The National in Richmond, The Birchmere in Alexandria, The Jefferson Theater in Charlottesville, The NORVA in Norfolk and The Carter Family Fold in Hiltons, to name a few.
- Hit a festival, from the big crowds at Lock'n to the smaller niche following at the Old Fiddler's Convention in Galax, Virginia has a festival to celebrate any genre of music.

- Virginia is a hiker's paradise from walks through coastal marshes to epic backpacking trips along the famed Appalachian Trail, Virginia has a footpath for all abilities, offering stunning views, flowing cascades, rhododendron and large hemlock trees.

- With 544 miles, Virginia is home to more miles of the Appalachian Trail than any other state. Find one of the 14 Appalachian communities in Virginia and plan a hike along the trail.
- As the only urban setting with Class III and IV rapids, Richmond offers rafting trips ranging from wild to mild. Experience the best of Virginia whitewater, rafting, floating, kayaking or canoeing along the historic James River.
- Virginia Beach is the perfect place to learn something new. Explore the outdoors by water and sign up for stand-up paddle board or surf lessons.
- Grab your bike, (or rent one!) and hit one of the many trails across the state.
 Cruise down the Creeper Trail in Abingdon. Travel the High Bridge Trail in Lynchburg. Explore the Virginia Capital Trail between Williamsburg and Richmond.

- Virginia is the first southern beach travelers can get to when traveling from the north.
- Chesapeake Bay is the largest estuary property in US at 200 miles long. The southern part of the bay belongs to Virginia, known for its beauty and bounty as well as countless outdoor experiences: fishing, swimming, boating, kayaking and sailing.



Virginia's mountains have inspired generations of songs, but their beauty may leave you speechless. The breathtaking views they provide reach beyond a purely visual appeal. Virginia mountain travelers experience unique Appalachian culture, heritage, music, regional art, world-class wine and everything imaginable for outdoor recreation. This beauty and bounty have inspired generations of musicians and travelers to explore and make themselves at home. This is why Virginia is for Mountain Lovers.

- Virginia is home to one-fourth of the Appalachian Trail and national icons including Shenandoah National Park and the Blue Ridge Parkway.
- Virginia is also home to lesser-known gems like the wilderness of the George Washington & Jefferson National Forest and the peaks and wild ponies of the Mount Rogers Recreation Area.
- Shenandoah National Park is located just 75 miles from DC, and boasts more than 200,000 acres of waterfalls, hiking trails, campsites, outdoor recreation.
- The Blue Ridge Parkway runs 217 miles in Virginia, with spectacular views, scenic drives and overlooks, including historic Skyline Drive.
- Virginia has 36 State Parks and 21 National Parks all ready to explore across the commonwealth.
- Mount Rogers is the highest mountain in Virginia at 5,729 feet.
- Virginia also has eight mountain ranges, with five peaks towering more than 5.000 feet.

- Plan a scenic drive along the 105-miles of Skyline Drive in the Blue Ridge Mountains. Stop at one of the 76 scenic overlooks found on the drive.
- Virginia is a hiker's paradise. Find a popular hike in Shenandoah National Park. Old Rag Mountain, Whiteoak Canyon or Stonyman are all popular hikes that offer a rewarding view at the top.
- Virginia is full of cool mountain towns just waiting to be explored. From Marion and Abingdon in southwest Virginia to Floyd and Roanoke nestled in the mountains and up to Harrisonburg and Staunton in the Shenandoah Valley.
