CORE MESSAGES

- The state of Virginia has implemented initiatives focused on making the state safe for people of color.
- Virginia State Police is committed to embracing inclusivity and diversity and is implementing initiatives to help make Virginia safe for all.
- DMOs, sites and attractions are working to improve the Black traveler experience at their locations.

PROOF POINTS

- With Governor Northam's creation of the Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion in 2019, Virginia is becoming a national exemplar in addressing the historical injustices and inequities that have existed for the last 400 years within all systems across our Commonwealth.
- In 2020, Governor Northam hosted discussions between community members and law enforcement officials on racial equity and police reform.
- Governor Northam has proposed criminal justice and police reform measures and has passed legislation that addresses institutional mechanisms that disproportionately terrorize people of color.
- As of 2020, Virginia State Police has begun working to create key DE&I leadership positions, has released an RFP for a DE&I partner, and has begun to implement recruiting practices that aim to diversify its workforce.
- Industry professionals across the state have participated in educational sessions designed to help the industry better understand the Black traveler experience and how to improve it at their locations.
