12:00pm- 1:30pm- Early Registration (Refuge Inn)

2pm-4pm : Pre-Event Activities (Drive your own vehicle to starting location)

Option #1: Join Chincoteague Step Through Time Tours for a walking history tour of the island with local historian, Cindy Faith. The tour is limited to 40 people and free parking is available downtown. After your ½ mile walking tour, there is an option from 3:30 p.m. - 4:30 p.m. to visit the Beebe Ranch, where Misty of Chincoteague lived.

Option #2 : Step aboard a complimentary guided boat cruise around the island (weather permitting) with Daisey's Island Cruises, looking for wildlife and wild ponies in their natural habitat while learning about our rich history from a knowledgeable captain. The pontoon boat will leave from Curtis Merritt Harbor, 2246 Curtis Merritt Harbor Drive, promptly at 2:30 p.m. Bring a warm jacket! Blankets will be available. This tour is limited to 60 people.

Option #3 – Enjoy a tasty option and enjoy some homemade ice cream at the Island Creamery, 6243 Maddox Boulevard - just voted 'Best Ice Cream Shop in the U.S.' by USA Today, or you can enjoy some retail therapy in our eclectic shops and boutiques located in historic downtown.

8:30am: Board the Pony Express Trolleys, based on group number, from your hotels.

Group 1:

9:00 a.m. - 9:30 a.m.: Arrive at Wallops Research Park for a tour of Rocket Lab's mission control room with Rachel Harley and view the construction of a rocket in the hangar. **NO PHOTOS ALLOWED IN THE HANGAR.**

9:30 a.m. - 9:45 a.m. : Travel to NASA Wallops Flight Facility with your guide, Rebecca Hudson, to see launchpads where rockets are launched. Learn about the missions that resupply the international space station, experiments that travel on some of these rockets, and about sounding rockets. Photo-op at the launchpad if no launches are planned for that day.

11:00 a.m. : Visit the NASA Visitor's Center to engage with interactive exhibits depicting the history of space exploration from Wallops Flight Facility. It has quite a story to tell! Great NASA souvenirs in their gift shop!

11:45 a.m.: Board Trolleys to return to Chincoteague Center for lunch. Lunch provided by Don's Seafood. *(Sponsored by the Town of Chincoteague)*

Group 2 : 9:00 a.m.: Arrive at Tom's Cove Visitor Center on Assateague Island. Take a walk on the beach to find seashells and breathe in that wonderful salt air or stay inside and view the exhibits that explain life on the seashore. Learn about sea creatures like horseshoe crabs, starfish, whelk, and more.

9:30 a.m.: Stop at the breathtaking Assateague Lighthouse -great photo op and chance to explore the maritime forest surrounding it. You can take the short walk or board the trolley to cross the street to the Herbert H. Bateman Educational Center.

10:00 a.m.: Arrive at the Herbert H. Bateman Educational Center. Engage in interactive displays interpreting life on a wildlife refuge. Learn about ecosystems, birds, and animals that call the Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge home. See a life-size bald eagle's nest!

10:45 a.m.: Board the Trolleys to visit the Museum of Chincoteague Island. You will be immersed in our history and culture. Learn about a waterman's way of life, oystering and clamming, our schools, churches, volunteer fire company, and so much more!
