- Walking Craft Beverage Tour in Downtown Harrisonburg. Downtown Harrisonburg, Virginia's First Culinary District, is home to five craft breweries and one cidery. Experience the Shenandoah Beerwerks Trail, get your passport stamped and learn more about the craft beverage scene in the Shenandoah Valley. (Meet at Pale Fire Brewing Company – there is a parking lot across the street.)
- **Downtown Art Tour –** Enjoy strolling through downtown Harrisonburg, an original Virginia Arts & Cultural District, and home to over two dozen murals and sculptures. Visit the iconic LOVEworks sign, see the four-story chess player mural and our beloved bronze ducks. (*Meet at the Harrisonburg Visitor Center*)
- Edith J. Carrier Arboretum Walk Experience the lovely arboretum on the JMU campus with three miles of wooded trails, a pretty pond, and charming children's garden. (Meet there or shuttle with the group from the hotel. Only six fit in the van. Wear appropriate shoes.)
- Journey Through Wine Country in Rockingham County: Experience the beauty and variety of Shenandoah Valley Vineyards. (*Tour limited to 14 people*)
- **Melrose Caverns Tour** Descend into one of the areas least known caves, Melrose Caverns, once a hiding place for troops during the Civil War. Visit this family-owned property, popular as a wedding venue and view Civil War graffiti left by the soldiers. *(Tour starts at Melrose Caverns. Meet there.)*
- **Rockingham Recreation Center Tour** Explore the brand new 74,000 square feet recreational center with four indoor basketball courts and a 200 meter indoor track. The venue is expected to be a popular sports tourism destination. (*Tour starts at the Rec. Center. Meet there.*)

**5:30pm: Welcome Reception** - JMU Atlantic Union Bank Center Club Room (1700 Jeff Bourne Way – free parking in the adjacent Ballard Parking Deck) Drinks and appetizers and a tour of the state of the art 8,500 seat multi-use facility which opened in November 2020 and hosts Duke's men's and women's basketball.

- **The Hardesty-Higgins Visitor Center** is a certified Virginia Visitor Center located in the charming (1848c) home of Harrisonburg's first mayor. One of the oldest buildings in the city featuring the Valley Turnpike Museum, Rocktown Gift Shoppe and Civil War Orientation Center.
- Tour the Larry W. Shifflet Fire Museum (*Take the elevator to the 3rd Floor*) The museum provides an in-depth look at firefighting through the ages through fire memorabilia such as uniforms, medals, an old fire alarm, photographs and equipment.
- Enjoy an artist demonstration at **Oasis Fine Art & Craft Co-op**. Stained glass sparkles from the entrance to the tread of the stairs leading to fine art paintings, ceramics, hand crafted jewelry and more within this beautiful artist co-op.
